Conditions of Entry

1. Exhibitors' attention is drawn to the information contained in the Australian Alpaca Association Showing Rules Manual (February 2003). The rules of showing apply to entrants in the Charles Ledger Show. Particular attention should be paid to those clauses that apply to exhibitors and handlers. The Association rules will be strictly enforced for the show. Dress code is specified in the Rules Manual.
2. For those exhibitors who wish to arrive on Friday September 24, after hours on site security will be provided. Please note, however that this does not include providing management of the animals. It is the responsibility of the owner/agent to ensure the animals are securely penned, watered and fed.
3. Enquiries regarding suitable accommodation for exhibitors should be directed to Heather Vickery (02) 4885 1040.
4. Exhibitors are reminded of the rules governing the penning of animals and relevant JDMAP classifications of the assessed and non-assessed animals. Animals must be exercised and must enter and exit their designated areas only. These areas will be clearly marked and no infringement will be permitted.
5. Exhibitors are requested to advise with their entry forms any requirement for animals that may need a higher pen. We cannot guarantee to provide same but will try to accommodate them. You are recommended to bring suitable pen panels with you.
6. Exhibitors are requested to pay particular attention to the completion of their entry forms. Correct details must be supplied and the relevant copies of the AAA certificate(s) must accompany the entry form. Age on the day of the show is the criteria for each class unless otherwise specified. All entries must have the completed JD Declaration attached. Entry forms should be submitted with legible printing, all sections must be completed and the entry signed by the owner or designated agent. **Entries by mail only**
- 7. Important Note- Copies of the AAA certificates must accompany the entry form. A1 forms will not be accepted as entry documents.**
8. Exhibitors' attention is drawn to the variation in the classes from previous years and all are requested to check carefully the section and class in which the animal(s) are entered. Animals may be changed into a different class after inspection subject to consultation and determination with the Stewards.
9. To assist with the running of the show, exhibitors are requested to arrive in time to have their animal(s) inspected and upon arrival to stay with their animal(s) until inspection is complete. Animals not inspected within the designated inspection times are subject to disqualification.
10. Questions or complaints on the day should be directed to the Chief Steward. Procedures for protests are specified in the Rules Manual and will be strictly adhered to.
11. The organisers of the Charles Ledger accept no responsibility for loss or damage to property, injury to persons or animals while at the show. All exhibitors are requested to show due consideration and concern for other participants and animals and to conduct themselves in a professional and proper manner.
